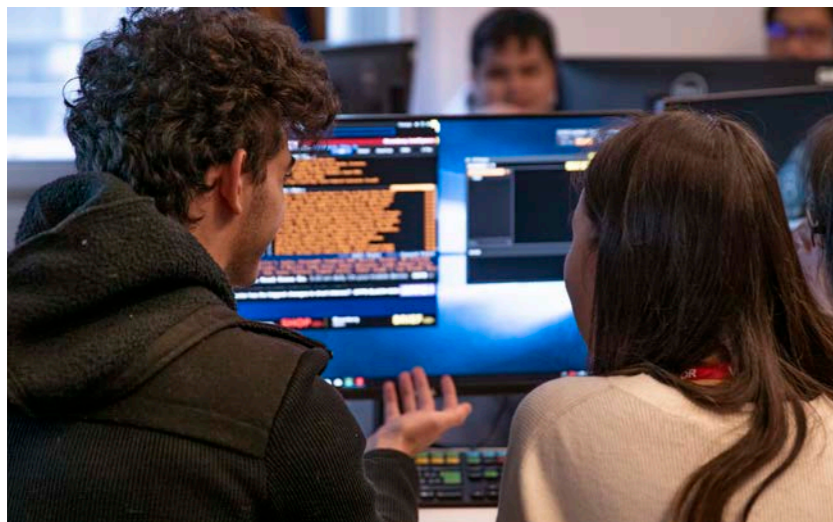

The balance of the booking is payable at least one month before arrival. If you request any additional services (e.g. airport transfers from locations not listed above), the cost of these will be included in your final invoice. A parental consent form must be completed and sent to our reservations department in order to complete your booking.

STRATEGIC DECISION-MAKING

COURSE OVERVIEW

Game Theory provides a fun and engaging introduction to the fundamentals of strategic decision-making. Through the analysis of games, students begin to understand the different roles that players can take, the behavior that constitutes the optimal strategy for playing these roles, and the behavior that constitutes the optimal strategy for assisting or countering these roles. Using this knowledge, students interpret the current behavior of teammates and/or opponents in an attempt to determine their roles, recall the optimal strategy associated with these roles, predict the future behavior of other players based on their optimal strategy, formulate their own optimal strategy to best assist teammates and/or counter opponents, recall the role associated with this strategy, and implement the strategy by behaving in accordance with the calculated role. Furthermore, students gain an appreciation for how these concepts can be applied to fields including but not limited to business, economics, political science, computer science, logic, biology, and philosophy.

EXPLORE THE BROADWAY MUSICAL THEATER INDUSTRY

Students will learn the steps required to make it on to a Broadway stage. They will look at the history of Broadway and gain an understanding of the many moving parts in the massive capitalist machine that is for-profit theater in the USA.

DEVELOP YOUR SKILLS IN:

Spoken voice, singing voice, movement, dance, acting, drafting, light design, set design, carpentry, minor electrics, model making, and sound engineering.

VOICE/MUSIC

Students will explore linklater voice technique as well as proper breath support, diction, and vocal placement. The students will then be individually coached on appropriate selections from Broadway musicals..

ACTING

Students will look at the methods of several well known acting teachers, namely Meisner, Adler, and Stanislavski. They will then apply these techniques to scene and monologue work.

CONSTRUCTION

In Construction students will build and paint the set to be used for the musical. They will learn basic construction techniques and be introduced to a variety of tools. They will learn how to hang, focus, and program theatrical lighting.

REHEARSAL

Rehearsal will be a time for production to meet performance. Any student that wishes to appear on stage will be given a part. They will receive staging instructions from the Director and work on dances and musical numbers with the Choreographer and Music Director. Those that do not wish to perform will use this time to program light and sound cues for the show as well as make costumes and props with instruction from the Technical Director.

DESIGN
