COURSE OVERVIEW

This course combines lectures, workshops, lessons and educational visits to create a well-rounded and thorough academic programme. Lectures will introduce topics such as research proposals, critical thinking and the place of philosophy in learning, while workshops will focus on practical skills such as verbal and non-verbal reasoning and using secondary sources in argumentation. During the lessons students will be able to develop their personal statement for university entrance and look at how selected university entrance tests work. Visits in the first week to both Oxford and Cambridge Universities will provide an insight into life at these prestigious institutions as well as what is required to succeed in their application processes.
